This is important to mention since my dad absolutely adored classical music (even played his cello from time to time), and often listened to Bach's music while he was painting in his home studio.

I often count my blessings that I have been so fortunate to have such a terrific DAD in my life who taught me to look for and value creativity in all walks of life...to think "out of the box or circle," and create my own ideas and designs. In fact, when I was a child, rather than have me color in numbered coloring books, he would hand me blank sheets of paper to let my creativity flow.

I want to point out that my Dad modeled kindness in many ways while I was growing up in his household. At the Joslyn Art Museum, he did the same, showing everyone continual respect. Moreover, my dad was often called "the life of a party" (with his keen sense of spontaneous humor), and "someone ahead of his time!" He was a kind of "pioneer" especially in exhibit design. For instance, he highly valued the concept of "cross sensing" in museums. He wanted visitors to be able to use each of their senses in order to fully appreciate various exhibits in museums.

Indeed, my dad was an amazing, beyond remarkable human being! May his immensely creative spirit and artistic legacy live on for years to come!


