Comments: Early in **Eugene Kingman's life**, he was drawn to the visual arts which formed the

foundation for his professional life's work. He became well versed in the mediums of printmaking, painting and drawing with his artworks forming a constant theme for him. Throughout his career he was very active as an artist, a teacher, a director of art museums and arts centers, a variety of murals and special projects for the National Parks. In 1946 Kingman was drawn to Omaha by Joslyn Art Museum to become

its assistant director and then director, positions he held for over 23 years.

This show focuses on his **fine art prints**, primarily lithographs and etching, and his **ink and graphite drawings**. As he moved from one facet of his life to another he

found inspirations from the regions he lived in and visited.

This show presents works from many of these facets: New England, Yale University, the mid-western and western states, Masa Verde National Park and sketches that

depict the wide variety of subjects that interested him.

Artworks: Framed and unframed stone lithograph prints, drawings using graphite, ink and black

lithography crayons and etching and dry point prints from copper plates are displayed.

The subjects are as widely varied as are the many places he lived and visited.

Many of the artworks on display will be available for purchase.
